Why Change?

- Current Constitution is not aligned with contemporary Governance processes – including democratic principles.
- The RSA Board is striving for a Constitution that:
 - Is fair to all stakeholders
 - Fosters collaboration between Clubs and Schools

Substantive Changes

The 2016 "sticking points"

- Members of the Association
- Categories of Members
- Voting rights
- Composition of the Board
- Ability to change the Constitution

Members / Categories

- An Association of Clubs / Schools
 - Not <u>individual</u> rowers
 - 33 club / school members rather than 598
- Member categories consolidated into:
 - Honorary Life Members non-voting (17)
 - Foundation Life Members voting (215)
 - Ordinary Members voting (18 Clubs & 15 Schools)

Members (cont.)

Creates a structure:

- *NSO* RA
- SSO RSA [RNSW/RV/RQ/RWA/RTAS/RACT]
 - RSA Members
 - Clubs & Schools (Rowers/Coaches/Umpires/Volunteers)
 - Honorary Life Members
 - Foundation Life Members
- 'Does this distance RSA from Rowers'?
- RSA key objective: "Promote Rowing in SA"
- Rowers remain our reason for existence
- Strategic plan focuses RSA on Rowers' interests

Voting Rights

Australian Sports Commission:

'Reform in Sports Governance'

- Options
 - One member one vote
 - Proportional voting
 - Club based weighted for size
 - Double Majority
 - Majority of clubs representing majority of members

Voting Rights (cont.)

Clubs as Members / Voting

- Clubs as members is consistent with many SSO's.
- In most cases "One C One V" and in some cases a weighting of votes for size rather than double majority.

- 2016 proposed that a change needed to have been presented and discussed with the Board before being formally put
 - Seen to be autocratic!
- Not a deal breaker revert to existing

Voting

Australian Sports Commission alternatives

- One club one vote?
 - probably not appropriate
- Double majority ?
 - Most democratic
 - Hardest to understand and administer
- Proportional voting ?
 - A surrogate for Double majority
 - Most common in Australian SSO's

Could this be a beginning to the Voting Solution?

- Potentially, the Board will consult, run forum, issue an information memorandum, consult further — (do what needs to be done)
