

EVENT REQUIREMENTS



2024 <u>INTERSTATE</u> STATE TEAM ATHLETES, COXSWAINS & COACHES

Please Note: Rowing South Australia ("RSA") will review these Event Requirements by no later than October of each year but may review and update these Event Requirements at any time, including by announcing and publishing further or varied requirements and standards prior to the relevant event or trial and the publication or notification shall take effect in accordance with the RSA Selection Policy.

BACKGROUND

The RSA State Team Selection Policy outlines the broad selection criteria for all rowers and coxswains and can be viewed on the <u>RSA website</u>. This document operates as an appendix to the Selection Policy and outlines the activities that rowers, coxswains and coaches must complete to be eligible for selection consideration in an Interstate State Team.

Please note athletes who are also seeking Australian Rowing Team selection will need to satisfy the requirements set out in the corresponding Event Requirements set by <u>Rowing Australia</u>.

All athletes must complete all activities stipulated in these Event Requirements unless there are Extenuating Circumstances (as defined in the Selection Policy) that prevent this.

Rowing South Australia Event Requirements: Interstate - Athletes, Coxswains & Coaches (Updated, 11 January



 <u>ELIGIBILITY</u>: Athletes, Coxswains and Coaches seeking selection must fulfil all requirements in the <u>RSA Selection</u> <u>Policy</u>.

Athletes to be considered for Para crews must be internationally classified either with a 'Confirmed' or 'Review' sport class status. A PR2 or PR1 athlete may nominate but will be required to complete testing under PR3 Criteria.

Athletes and Coxswains to be considered for Youth crews must be classified as an Under 21 rower until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches the age of 20.

 <u>NOMINATIONS</u>: Athletes, Coxswains and Coaches seeking selection are required to nominate via the <u>RSA</u> <u>Website</u>. The Selectors may, at their discretion, accept late nominations up to the completion of the selection events.

Coach nominations close: 5:00pm on Friday 24th November 2023.

Athlete & Coxswain nominations close: 5:00pm on Friday 15th December 2023.

- 3. <u>GENERAL CRITERIA:</u> As far as is practical, for NTC based athletes, the results from National Senior A Selection Event Requirements listed as Mandatory activities in the RSA Selection Requirements will be used as the basis to select these athletes into the South Australian team.
 - (a) Coaches_will be selected as a team under the guidance of the Head Coach. All coaches will work with and report to the Head Coach along with the other selectors where necessary.

The selectors will select a strong cohesive coaching team which will be selected to ensure quality coaching across all boats. Coaches may or may not be selected for a specific crew depending on the nominated coaching pool. Coaches may be allocated more than one crew.

- 4. <u>MANDATORY EVENTS:</u> Mandatory Selection Events apply to all nominees. Nominees who cannot participate in any of the mandatory selection activities must apply for an exemption for each activity that they are unable to participate in.
- <u>ERGOMETER TESTING</u>: Is to be conducted in line with Australian Rowing Team Ergometer Testing protocols, available on the <u>RA website</u>.
 - (a) All ergo testing must be completed at athletes' club/school and be supervised by a coach. Results must be submitted on the day of completion via the <u>RSA</u> <u>Website</u>.
 - (b) State nominated coaches are not to attend these erg tests as they are completed at the athlete's personal club/school. Only if the selected coach is the coach of the nominated athlete in their regular program should they supervise them.

6. <u>WEST LAKES REGATTA</u>: All nominated athletes are required to participate in the Small Boat Combine event. Athletes are required to race in either a single scull or a pair. It is up to the athlete to ensure their club/school enters them prior to close of entries as no late entries can be accepted into regattas.

Athletes competing at the NSW Rowing Championships are exempted from the Small Boat Combine at the concurrent February West Lakes Regatta. Small boat results from the NSW Rowing Championships may be considered by the selection panel.

- <u>SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS:</u> all nominated athletes are encouraged to participate in the South Australian State Championships.
- SEAT RACING/SPEED ORDER: The Selectors reserve the right at their sole discretion to choose the crew combinations and the matrix of seat racing. Selectors reserve the right to conduct a Speed order trial where seat racing is not required or after the crew has been selected.
 - (a) State Team Coaches are expected to be available for seat racing to assist the Selectors in the organisation and delivery of the trials. Coaches are to remain objective and not operate outside of the selector's instructions.
 - (b) Coxswains must be available for seat racing across all days.
- <u>AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS:</u> All successful athletes are required to compete in the Interstate Regatta and at least one other event at the National Championships unless otherwise negotiated with the selectors.
 - (a) State Team coaches are expected to attend the Australian National Championships and be available for pre row/s in the days leading up to the race.
- <u>TRAINING</u>: All athletes are expected to be completing a full training load outside of state team event requirements. Coaches are expected to attend and organise all trainings.
 - (a) Training day: is mandatory and is used for selection. Coaches and selectors will use this opportunity to look at the crew cohesion and adjust seating orders to determine the optimum configuration. Athletes must be available for boat loading/unloading.
 - (b) West Lakes Trainings: are compulsory with a minimum of one session per week (with exceptions). West Lakes trainings will be negotiated with the State Team coach as to determine the most suitable day/s.
- <u>LIGHTWEIGHT ATHLETES</u>: No adjustments will be made for lightweight athletes contending for heavyweight crews.

Lightweight athletes to be considered in a lightweight crew are required to be within the following weight ranges:

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- (a) Ergo tests, prior to 1 January 2024, athletes must be no greater than the following weights – Men 75.0kg and women 62.0kg.
- (b) From 1 January 2024, all ergo tests and West Lakes Regattas, athletes must be no greater than FISA maximum weight (Men 72.5kg and Women 59.0kg).
- (c) For the seat racing and/or speed trials athletes must be no greater than FISA maximum weight (Men 72.5kg and Women 59.0kg).
- (d) For racing at the National Championships, athletes must abide by the rules of racing at these respective events (meet the average crew weights of Ave Crew: Men 70.0kg and Women 57.0kg).
- 12. COXSWAINS: coxswain selection is gender neutral. Coxswains seeking selection must demonstrate they are able to make the weight limit.
 - (a) Coxswains have a target weight of 55kg (or less) at the following events:
 - South Australian Rowing Championships
 - Seat Racing/Speed Order Trials
 - Australian Rowing Championships
 - (b) All coxswains are required to participate at the 2024 South Australian Rowing Championships. In this regatta all coxswains must:
 - steer an Eight.
 - have a live tracker attached to the boat and recorded during that race.
 - submit a voice recording of that race.
 - (c) All coxswains must submit an additional voice recording from an 8+ race, recorded at another Rowing SA regatta in February 2024.
- 13. <u>BENCHMARKS</u>: will be used to help make selection decisions by the selectors. Refer to the <u>RSA benchmarks</u> <u>policy</u> for more information.
 - (a) Selectors reserve the right to not select an athlete/crew if there is a failure to meet minimum benchmarks.

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
