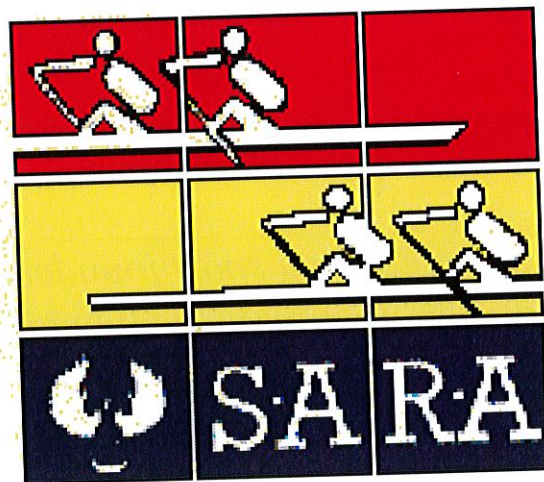

Chairman's Welcome



It is with pleasure that I present the Chairman's Report for 2006/2007

Whilst it was a year of many exciting initiatives and achievements, the highlight undoubtedly was the announcement by the State Government that they would provide funding of \$2.4M to upgrade the A M Ramsay Regatta Course at West Lakes. This will restore the course to FISA International standards and will enable SARA to again be eligible to bid for events such as the Australian Rowing Championships and indeed International events.

Planning is already underway and work on the course is expected to commence at the end of the coming season and be completed prior to the 2008/2009 season. Enhancements will include a flexible purpose designed lane buoying system, starting and finishing pontoons and judges tower. In addition to above, SARA is also actively exploring avenues for additional funding to also upgrade 'off water' facilities.

This outstanding outcome will provide us with a facility as good as any in the Southern Hemisphere and will give us many opportunities to take rowing in South Australia to the next level. Your General Manager, Barbara Fenner, played the pivotal role in this achievement and I know I share the thoughts of the entire rowing community in thanking her sincerely.

The other major achievements for the year included the successful launch of ROMSv1 (Rowing Online Management System) combined with the introduction of a Rowers Score system, which is basically a handicap system for all rowers competing in senior events.

Whilst there was a little initial resistance to these changes, as the season progressed, the overall advantages became very apparent and acceptance

grew to a very high level. Special thanks are due the administration personnel of the Clubs, Schools and SARA who worked so well together to ensure a positive outcome.

One of the major issues facing us at this time last year was a critical shortage of BRO's and other volunteers, resulting in a real danger that parts of the regatta program would need to be cancelled. Thanks to an outstanding recruitment program initiated by Christine MacLaren, Paul Logan and Penny Halliday some 40 new BRO's commenced training and a number of other volunteers were 'found'. Numbers did drop away a little as the season progressed however we remained in a far stronger position than had previously been the case. The recruitment and retention of volunteers is absolutely vital for the future success of SARA and must be a priority every year.

This will be my final report as your Chairman as I have needed to resign owing to my recent election to the Board of Rowing Australia. This will formally end my sixteen years on the SARA Executive, with six as Chairman. When one looks back over this period, much has been achieved by SARA and all those involved and I am privileged to have played a small part. I will, however, remain active in umpiring duties wherever possible so you won't be able to get rid of me completely!!

Finally, our General Manager, Barbara Fenner has also announced her resignation. Barb has had an ongoing association with SARA since 1989 when the SASI program commenced, including the past 5 years as General Manager. Her period as General Manager is full of outstanding achievements and far seeing initiatives and her intellect, energy and determination will be greatly missed. She has, however, played a major role in developing SARA to a stage where we are now in a position to look to employ a full time General Manager. This is a logical and very positive next step and will enable SARA to further strengthen the management and development of rowing in South Australia. I know Barb will enjoy being able to devote more time to her young family, but am equally sure that she will not be lost to SA Rowing.

Major Events

Once again SA volunteers showed that they run great events and that rowers love coming to West Lakes to compete in major events.

- SA Rowing hosted the Australian Youth Cup Regatta for the fourth consecutive year in September. There were at total of eight teams competing – one from each State and only one this year from New Zealand. Congratulations to our SA team who topped the pointscore of the Australian teams.
- For the second time SARA event managed the Schools' Head of the River Regatta and once again the day was a great success. With Annesley College added to the program this year there are now a total of 13 schools competing in this event.

This year we celebrated 30 years of racing at West Lakes as well as celebrating the 100th birthday of Charles Amiel during the First Grade State Championships Regatta:-



- Charles was made a Life Member of SARA in 1950 for his then contribution to rowing - he was initially a member of Mercantile Rowing Club which had to be dissolved in 1954 and he then joined Adelaide RC.

- All through his life Charles collected local, national and international newspaper and magazine articles about rowing. In the mid 1990's he handed his 90 volume collection of scrapbooks to the Mortlock Library. He stood down as SARA Chief Historian and Vice President in 2003 at the age of 96!

Regatta Management & Administration

SA rowers have managed the significant changes to entry and racing this season very well. Good feedback was received throughout the season and also through the end of season Rower Survey which have been incorporated into the Regatta Planning for 2007/08.

A concerted effort was made to improve the quality of the hardcopy Regatta Program (helped enormously by the new office photocopier) and hence enable regatta hosts to offer their sponsors a better product. Both Scotch College and Wilderness School took great advantage of this and showed the rest of us what can be done. Well done to both these schools in producing a more than great carnival atmosphere at the regatta.

Thank you to Steph Monson for her incredible calm and efficiency in producing the Regatta Box each week!

Finance

Obviously the West Lakes Upgrade \$2.4million allocated in the State Budget is our biggest item to report for this year. We are extremely pleased that after nearly 10 years of negotiation we will be able to host the 2009 National Championships during our 125th anniversary celebrations.

The 2006/7 finances have been efficient and to budget.

Strategic Plans

Processes have started on the development of the 2008-2012 Strategic Plan and we look forward to implementation of programs particularly to assist clubs development.

SARA Awards Night

The Awards Night was once again held in May at the end of the season. The SARA clubrooms once again hosted a capacity crowd to toast the success of the acknowledged Award winners.

Rowing Australia

Our sincere thanks must be extended to Michael Eastaughffe for his tireless hours as our SA Councillor and Competition Manager for Rowing Australia. His work indirectly affects all SA rowers as they train to row in regattas locally and interstate.

SASI Rowing

Joint Management Committee meetings and other joint development activities have continued to focus on the elite and how to develop more elite.

Affiliates

We have continued our association with Sport SA, SA Olympic Committee, City of Charles Sturt and City of Adelaide.

Sponsors

SARA has once again received major financial support from the Office for Recreation and Sport (ORS) and Rowing Australia contributing towards the cost of the Development Manager and her activities. The AIS

Talent Search program has also been a significant contributor to the Riverland program.

Hebfotos, Ebor Computing, Johnston Racing and West End continue to provide wonderful support to our great sport and we thank them along with all the myriad of volunteers that assist SARA in all facets of rowing competition and development.

Some thoughts from Barbara as she resigns from the General Manager position after 5 years....

- **SARA is the association of clubs and schools** and our Rules provide us with the framework of operation - **SARA is not** the volunteer Boat Race Official at regattas, or the “volunteer face” in regatta control, or the staff voice on the end of the phone in the office during the week, or even the elected Officers!
- The volunteer Executive Board and various Commissioners and the paid staff all work hard but they essentially just run the day to day affairs as directed by the Rules, Policies and Strategies adopted by the General Committee (one delegate from each club/school who meet quarterly) who elect the Officers each year. (why is there is never an abundance of personnel for these positions?)

The General Committee are actually representative of all the rowers who belong to the Clubs and Schools (nearly 1,400 in last few years) and so SARA is really **all the rowers**. Thus all rowers have the ability to canvass their fellow club members and other clubs and then put forward suggestions, ideas, notices of motion !

Don't complain or sign petitions about something without finding out the facts. Then do something about it if you feel it needs to change! At the same time accept the majority rules the “big picture”.

Development Report

2007 has seen two new and exciting development projects being added into the SA Rowing Development portfolio:-

Riverland

Through funding from the National Talent search and the SA Government, we were able to appoint a fulltime Riverland Development Officer/Coach to be based out of the existing Berri and Renmark Rowing clubs.

The roles focused on two main areas.

1, to revitalize rowing in the Riverland by assisting the Clubs to grow and promoting rowing through the community and schools, by initiating Try and Go Rowing courses out of the existing Clubs and assist new clubs to develop

2. To identify and recruit rowing talent and initiate the “Riverland to London” talent identification program to run alongside the metropolitan “Talent Catch” program.

Josh Whitwell was appointed in October 2006, and began to work on developing the Clubs, and recruiting a small “Riverland to London” squad, two of whom attended the National Championships in 2007. Sam Gallard (Renmark Rowing Club) won a Silver medal in the U17 M1x, and Tom Sullivan competed in the MU191x and SB1x.

We look forward to seeing continuing growth in numbers in the Riverland rowing over the next year with the vision of creating a regional competition structure.

Boat Race Official Training

With the lack of Boat race Officials (BROs) at crisis point a major recruitment drive was put in place recruiting over 40 “new” BRO trainees.

A training package was put together, based on the Rowing Australia draft BRO Level one Syllabus, and all enthusiastic new recruits were trained over a series of evenings.

New recruits were then given log books and rostered on through the season to give them the needed practical experience to enable them to “be assessed”. Rowing Australia has recently announced the “Level 1” Syllabus with assessment package, which is now a priority to implement with this ready for assessment.



GO Rowing!

The **Try Rowing**” and “**Go Rowing**” continues to service all rowing venues and Clubs, although there is still a huge potential for the program to reach capacity

Try Rowing and Go Rowing continued to be run on behalf of Clubs and at various venues including Murray Bridge, Goolwa, Renmark, Berri and Limestone Coast. Again, numbers of people being actively introduced to rowing, and learning to row have increased as well as the numbers flowing onto Clubs has also increased.

This community based program also services the current need for “pay as you go” sport, where people chose to try a sport for a period of time, learning the basic skills before making the decision of whether to continue with the sport.

The program also continued to offer sculling schools through out the year and quite a few rowers took advantage of the specialist coaching available.

Development Camps

Training Camps were also part of our Club development program this year. They were open to all Club programs and also the "Talent Catch" and "Riverland to London" program rowers. The July **Murray Bridge Camp** aimed to get rowers continuing winter training, (also educating them in real cold weather training!!!!)



The **Murraylands** camp for seven days in January near aimed to get the 40 rowers ready for Nationals. These camps were great fun as well as being an opportunity for all the programs to work age group combinations together in preparation for the National Championships.

Talent Catch

The Talent Catch group aims to take young talented athletes identified by the SASI Talent Search Program, and give them the grounding and skills to progress up the High Performance ladder.

As the group is aimed at young athletes with potential, the emphasis is on learning skills and building up fitness. We encourage the athletes to do other sports, but there is a base commitment to the program as outlined above.

The Talent Catch Program continues to run as an underpinning program to fast track athletes into the SASI High Performance Programs.

John Curtis continued to coach the squad in 2006/07, and with an intake mid-year the squad currently has 14 athletes (6 male/8 female) training on various tailored programs, with 5 Talent Catch moving into the Junior Target Squad to train with Andrew Butler (3 male/2 female).

Although based at West Lakes, the program still works closely with the Clubs, with rowers racing for their Clubs through the summer and at the Winter Time trials.

General development/recruitment

This year we have seen the

- ✓ Continuation of the non-rowing School Indoor Rowing program
- ✓ Annual Riverland High School Sport Expo day provided new young members for Berri and Renmark
- ✓ Short term appointment of Nick Andrew as the Schools Development Officer to promote rowing widely in non rowing schools and community groups offering and promoting
 - Assembly talks
 - Indoor Rowing sessions
 - Water sessions

The inaugural **Northern Zones Indoor Rowing Competition** was grown through the success of the Western Zones Indoor Rowing Competition. Eight schools took part, and over 120 students competed against each other in the final competition age group categories and team "fun" events.

The **Go Rowing "be active"** message has been continually promoted widely at University Open Days, Health Shows, school newsletters, newspaper adverts. Holiday Clinic guides and school networks out at schools participating in the Indoor Rowing program which is offered (in partnership with SASI Rowing) to schools through Sportshorts .

Adaptive Rowing

The Murray Bridge Adaptive Program continues to grow, and the metropolitan "Go Rowing" program is an all inclusive program that has been promoted to Adaptive groups.

Assisted with State Govt funding we have purchased a special adaptive single scull.



We saw a group of intellectually disabled students “Try Rowing” and Nick Andrew in his role of School Development Officer, made initial contacts with **Adaptive groups**, and started the process of encouraging them to “Try Rowing” or try “Indoor Rowing”

In partnership with APOC (Australian Paralympic Organising Committee) headed by Katrina Webb (ex- rower) we have been involved in some initial Talent Search days for Adaptive athletes.

With the inclusion of Rowing in the 2008 Para Olympics looming closer, the adaptive talent search process is being looked at, and will be part of the Talent Catch talent identification recruitment drive.

Coaching Education

National Coaches Conference- Gold Coast, Oct

A group of 5 SA coaches headed up to the Gold Coast for the bi-annual coaches conference.

Ron Mobbs (Murray Bridge Rowing Club) proudly represented SA in an open forum involving a panel of Club coaches who run highly successful programs.

NCAS Coaching Courses

During the year we ran three **Level 1 NCAS** courses and one **Level 3 NCAS** course.

The new system accredits coaches at the Level 1 level to coach under supervision, but to date few are progressing to the Level 2 accreditation. The new system requires that NCAS L1 coaches have one years experience before they progress to L2, hence a waiting period, but it is also essential that coaches are accredited to the level at which they are coaching. Level 2 accredits coaches to work independently, run independent programs and be educated in the skills required to coach at this level.

The **NCAS L3** course engaged 15 coaches, and involved some fantastic presenters including Brian Richardson (Rowing Australian Men’s Head Coach) who presented two nights of technique at the University Boat Shed.

This is a good opportunity to thank the NCAS Assessors for their assistance in assessing the trainee coaches over the year.

Winter Coach Education sessions

We continued to run the popular **monthly Coach Education sessions** - Nutrition, Visualisation, Technique and Rigging were among the topics offered.

Noel Donaldson, Rowing Australia High Performance Director, presented a discussion session on “**Beijing and Beyond**” which allowed members to see where Australian Rowing is aiming, and also provide a forum for all those unanswered questions!

These projects could not happen without both the financial and in-kind support of the Office for Sport Recreation and Racing, Rowing Australia, South Australian Sports Institute and most importantly the SA Clubs, Schools and members.

I would like to thank all the above for their support of these projects and for playing a vital role in **developing rowing in South Australia**.

Building/Facilities Commission Report

SA Rowing was delighted to be told that the SA Government had allocated \$2.4m for a major course upgrade in the 2007/08 budget. These funds have been eagerly sought after by SARA for the past eight years. Our GM, Barbara Fenner, is to be congratulated on her successful recent efforts to move the Government to this happy decision. The funds will bring the course buoying system, starting facilities, and judges tower back to FISA international standard. There is much detailed planning to be done over the next few months with physical work set to start in March of 2008.

The current vision is that the SA Government will own the course improvements, will conduct the detailed design and approval processes, will supervise construction, will take responsibility for maintenance, and will negotiate with SARA an appropriate management arrangement with SARA as managing agent on behalf of rowing, canoeing and dragon boating. It is proposed that the Development Assessment Commission will be the approving authority and not the City of Charles Sturt. Of course both the City and SARA will be heavily involved in these planning and construction processes.

Improvements to the on shore facilities

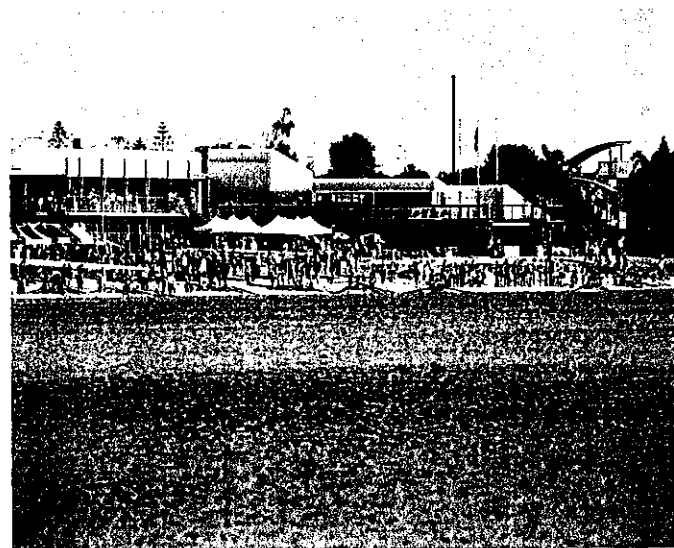
A further grant of \$1.7m regional development grant is being sought to bring the land based facilities, pontoons and social/management premises up to international standard with work planned to occur concurrently with the course upgrade. Documents have been prepared in conjunction

with Cheesman Architects who have had an association with the site for over 30 years.

Current minor works including the enclosure of the current temporary umpires' boats storage area, the enclosure of the area under the western ramp, paving in front of the clubrooms, northern wash down area and rain/wash down water conservation have been planned and funded. Kennett Builders have been engaged to design and construct these improvements which must be completed in time for the Australian Masters' Games in October.

The planning and design approval process with the City of Charles Sturt has been slow due to indecision re the appropriate tenure and fee for the northern wash down area located on Rowers Reserve.

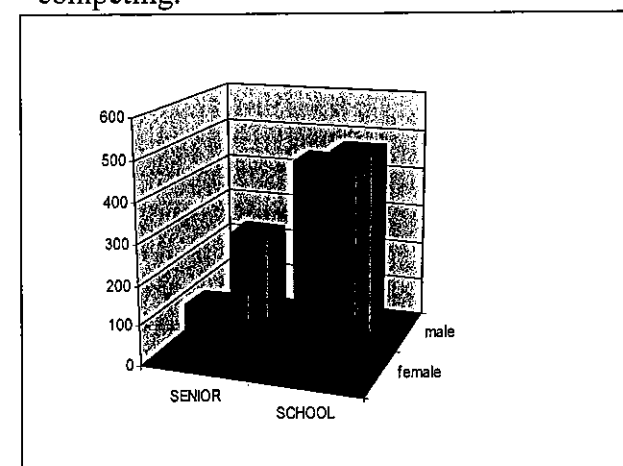
Regatta Commission Report

This season saw the introduction of the 3 R's for SA regattas –

- **ROMS for online entry** which is a national system and slowly being developed and used by all states – the proposed functionality will help all clubs with all their rowing management in the future
- **RP7 for the regatta program** which is a very user-friendly program and not only produces the regatta program efficiently with names in all crews (a new concept for SA regattas since over 6 years ago) but also simply produces many other reports on a regatta by regatta basis
- **RS is the new concept of Rowing Score** which once allocated (4.0 – 0.0 depending on ability) then changes with each win/loss - how much the change is depends on the rowers age and the distance raced; crews race in grades where the crew average RS is calculated so crews of equal ability are racing each other regardless of age.

Major Events

The major regattas, other than the nineteen SARA premierships regattas, held during the year were the Australasian Youth Cup, the Regional Masters Games and the Head of the River where another school (Annesley College) were eligible to join this year making a total of 13 SA schools now competing.



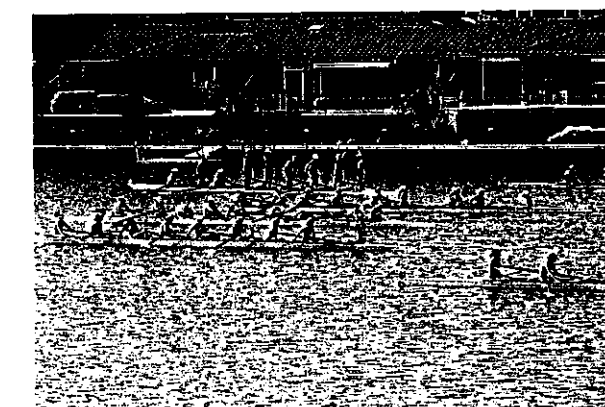
Rower Registration

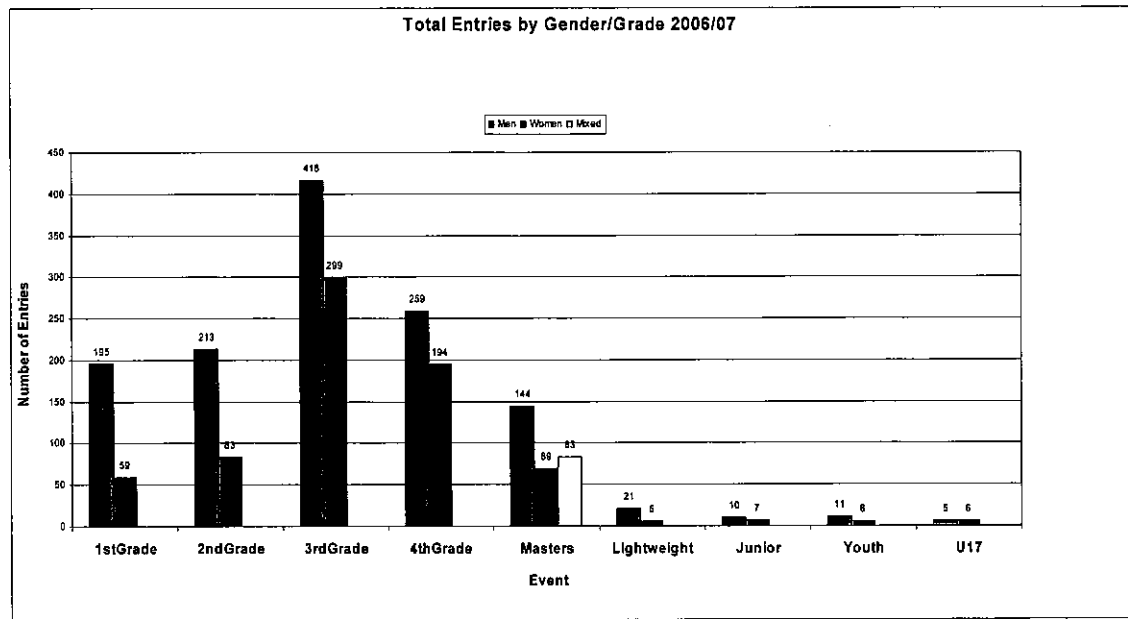
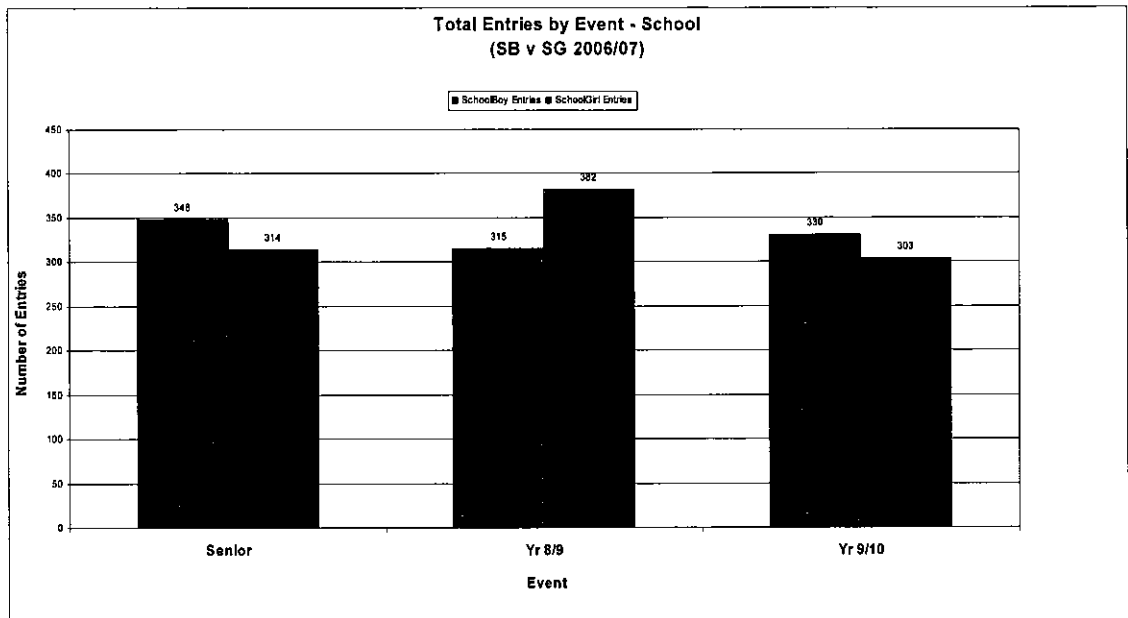
Regatta Entry

Total crew entries for the Premiership Season were again over 4,000 with approximately 50/50 between entries in school events and club grade/age events.

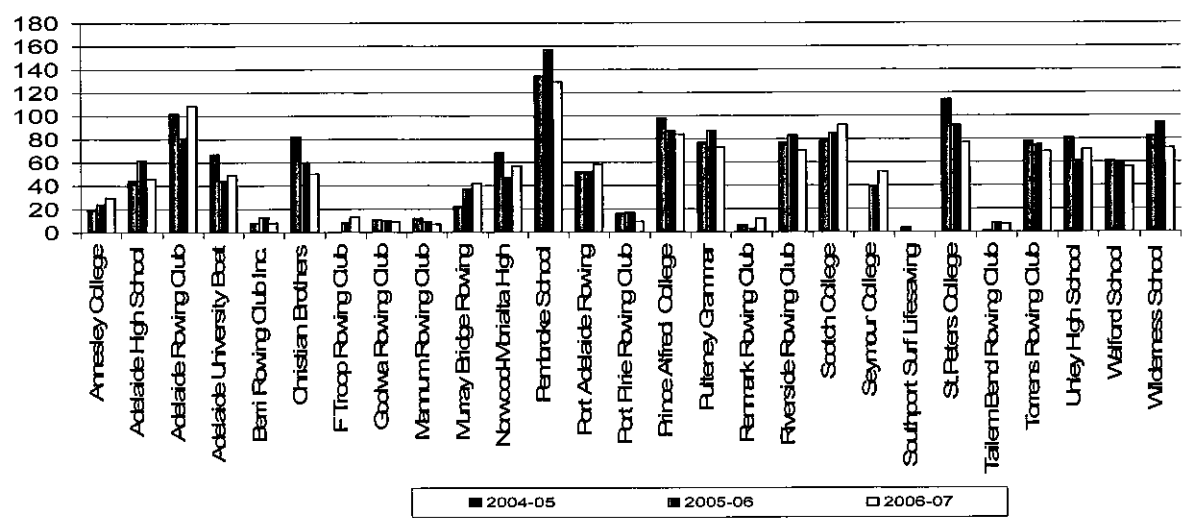


Finally, we are often admired by other sports for our efficiency and organisation of our competition – thank you to all the volunteers for assisting to make this happen!

Umpires Commission Report



The following Report is presented on behalf of the volunteer Boat Race Officials (BRO's) for the 2006/2007 Rowing Season.

The Regatta Season in SA is now a 12 month activity. Major regattas are held between Oct-Apr each season, with the rest of the year being taken up with a mix of monthly Winter Regattas, a number of National Events like the Australian Youth Cup. We officiated at 4 country regattas and 16 city regattas which included 4 Championship Events, the Regional Masters Games and the Head of the River.

A number of our Level 3 (National Licence) BRO's were invited to officiate at 5 Rowing Australia events and Mr Michael Eastaughffe (Level 4 - International Licence) was invited to attend the World Cup Regatta in Lucerne. Mr Steve Pennington was awarded a Level 2 (State Licence) at the start of the season and that now gives the Commission 13 State Licensed Officials of which 7 are National Licence holders and 2 are International Officials.

All regattas require a large number of volunteers (over 20) to assist in the organisation and running and at the start of the season it was necessary to call for help in this area and seek additional 'trainees' for a number of the jobs. The initial response was great and I spoke to 40 interested people over 3 Information Nights. This number slowly diminished through the season and I have around a third of the original group who are close to obtaining their Level 1 BRO accreditation.

The increase is required for succession, back-up, to reduce the 'burn out' factor and to have an appropriate number to be able to arrange a functional roster. The more we have the easier it gets OR no BRO's, no regattas! I thank the committed group we do have for their untiring contribution every week and in particular Mr Jeff Erickson, who with the support of the Glanville Sea Scouts Group, makes sure that our Umpires' Boats are fuelled, launched, washed and stored each regatta.

Rules and Regulations are required for our sport and the Umpires' Commissions around Australia

are formally adopting the Rowing Australia Racing Code as the 'norm' to operate with, in place of their local regulations and this then helps the athletes with uniformity wherever they compete. Similarly, the National Officiating Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) is being introduced around Australia to enable 'standardised' BRO licensing levels to be adopted, again assisting the athletes with a consistent umpiring approach. I am aware that many of our new coaches and club coordinators are not familiar with the "Racing Code" and its requirements, so the Umpires Commission is working closely with the Coach Training Courses to hopefully improve that situation.

There is still a need for improvement in basic boat control / handling skills before entering new crews in a regatta. It is not only demoralising for a novice crew not able to turn, back or 'touch up' to the start line, but very frustrating for the BRO in charge of those crews. I make myself available to speak to your Club coaches, crews and coxswains if you require. The pre-season seminar for school and club coaches and coxswains is usually poorly attended, although highly recommended, and it is essential for safety alone that we speak to as many as possible before a new season commences. Ongoing, random weighing of coxswains has again been necessary as a number of Clubs continue to ignore or abuse the rules. Crews that do not listen or adhere to instruction have been and will continue to be removed from their race, an embarrassing situation easily corrected!

To endeavour to make our regattas an ongoing, enjoyable experience, I welcome any feedback (and criticism) that you might have that could help in this process. Training for Boat Race Officials and Boat Drivers will continue and more will be advertised on this prior to next season.

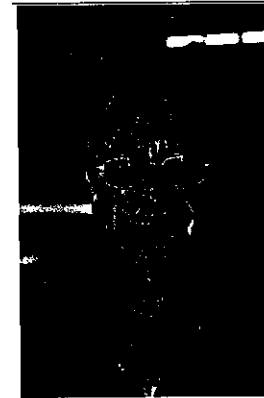

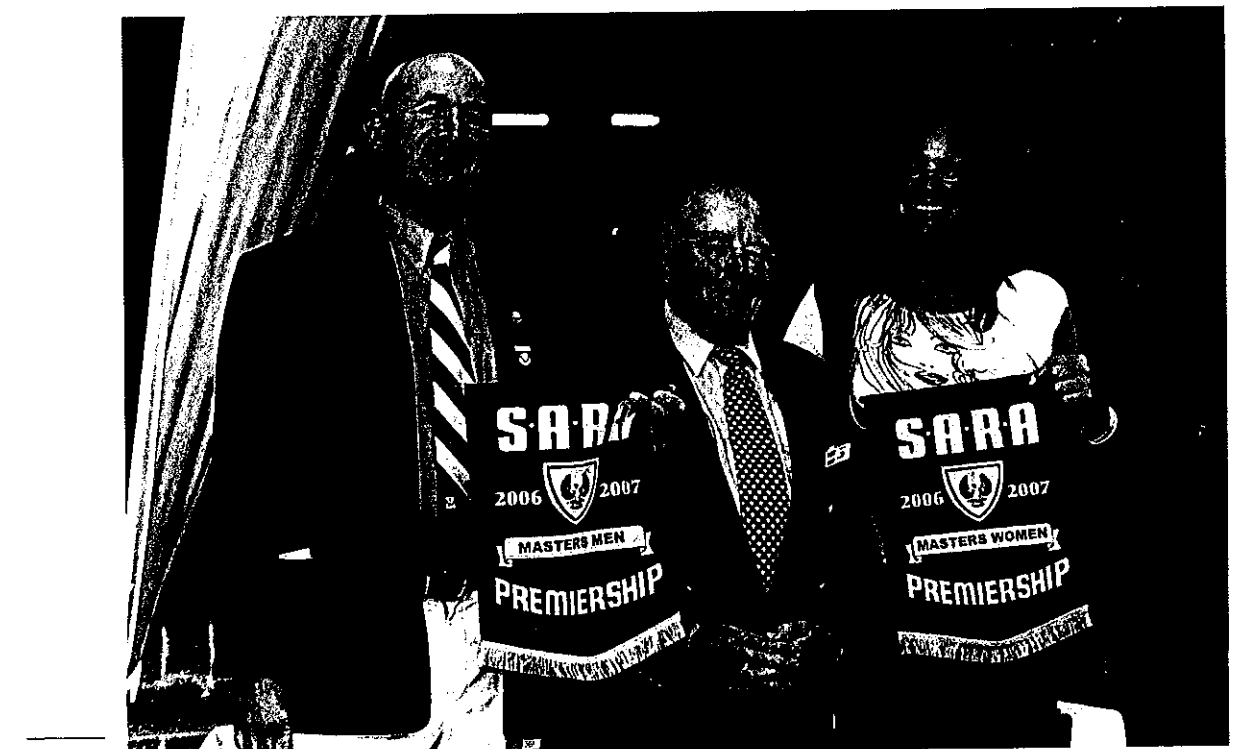
Input from the masters at the regatta planning day for 2007/8 has resulted in more masters only events for the coming season.

This year South Australia fielded State crews in Men's 4x and 8+ and a Women's 8+ at the National Master's Championships at the Penrith Olympic course. All crews undertook

a rigorous training program under their coaches, Colin Trinnie and Elaine Gutteres for the women and Anna Tree for the men. All crews performed very well in their time trials. At the Nationals, again all crews performed above their trials and finished well in the mix. Alas the bench mark for the Men's 8+ was lifted even higher with a record time recorded by the winning crew from Victoria, but most of the SA crew are keen to work for next year to close the gap. The regatta was a success for SA with a number of crews winning medals including gold in both age and mixed events.

On behalf of the Commission I would like to thank Barb Fenner, Christine Maclaren and the state coaches for their efforts in supporting masters rowing in SA. As both our secretary, David Neall and I have had to retire from the commission at the end of this season, I would encourage masters to consider nominating to fill these roles.

State Team Report

The South Australian State Team had State representative crews in the Interstate Regatta, Australian Youth Olympic Festival and the Youth Cup Regatta.

South Australia continued to focus of the development of the Youth Crews, but also saw the importance of the development of the Kings Cup crew, with some of the successful Youth athletes moving up into the Senior age category.

The Youth Cup Regatta 1-3rd September 2006 here at West Lakes proved that the development of the Youth athletes is staring to show fruit, with the points for first place being decided on the last race! South Australia finished a close 2nd behind New Zealand, and top of all the Australian States.

Our success was short lived as at the The Australian Youth Olympic Festival, held at Penrith in January 2007, our team was outclassed in all events by the world class teams from the other States and Territories, Great Britain and New Zealand. Without our top ranked athletes, our team lacked the experience to be in contention for any medals.

At the Interstate Regatta at Lake Barrington, Nagambie 12th March 2007, we fielded six out of the eight crews.

- Our Gold medal winners in the WL4x race showed the rest of the field some world class rowing. We welcome Marguerite Houston representing SA this year, to join Amber Halliday, Miranda Bennett and Maja Fiddler to lead the race the whole way.
- With the selection of the M1x being postponed to the National Championship, James McRae narrowly beat Chris Morgan to take the President’s Cup spot. In a sensational performance for a young athlete in an experienced field, McRae certainly made his mark and did SA proud winning a Silver medal against a world class field.
- Stephanie Monson performed a good race against a top class field of women’s scullers
- The Men’s 8+ raced well, having continued to strengthen the crew with

- youth rowers moving up into the Senior category
- The ML4- finished 6th showing inexperience against world and Olympic medalists.
 - Men’s Youth 8+ did not perform to expectations, struggling with the conditions and the lane draw.
 - The WY8+ raced well into 4th place, with a young crew. We look forward to seeing the development of some of these girls over the next few years in the Youth squads.

Strategically in 2006-07 the State Team focused on:

- The implementation of coaching job specifications to make it clear the expectations and role of a State Coach, understanding that there is a balancing act to play with individual aspirations of national selection.
- Reviewing the Selection process and ensuring fairness of selection
- Continuing to build up the quality of the Youth crews, especially in the small boats at the Youth Regattas

The key Issues for 2007-08 are:

- Continuing to tighten up the selection process, exemptions and medical issues.
- Seeking sponsorship to alleviate the constant pressure on young athletes to fund State trips (up to three per year)
- Ensuring that target squads are established to underpin the Youth Crews to ensure continuity of quality of our crews.
- Fielding a W8+

Thanks must be given to the selection panel, Adrian David (SASI),James Seppelt, Ian Wilson (AUBC),Steve Pennington (AHS), for their time and dedication to selecting the crews.

The coaches all put in 100% effort in ensuring that the crews were well prepared, and for their efforts in coordinating their busy lives with “more coaching”.
The continual support of the SA Rowing community including Tim Ward, and the many

others that assist in the transport, feeding and looking after of the teams is fantastic.

Last but not least the Clubs must be thanked for their support with equipment and the support of all the State crews.

The South Australian Rowing community is proud of all its State Team members with their dedication and pride in representing their State,

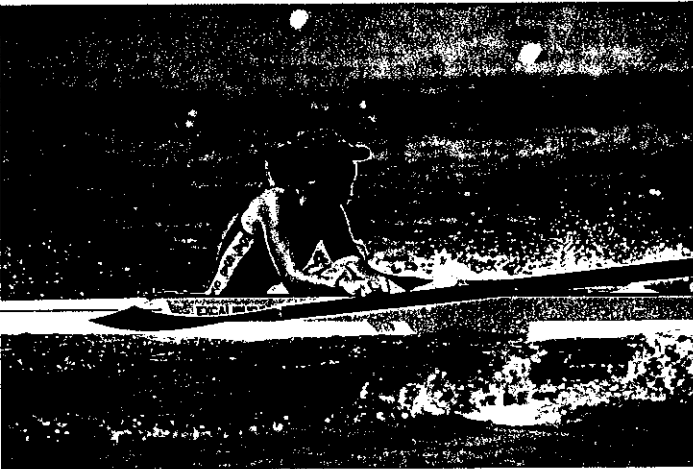

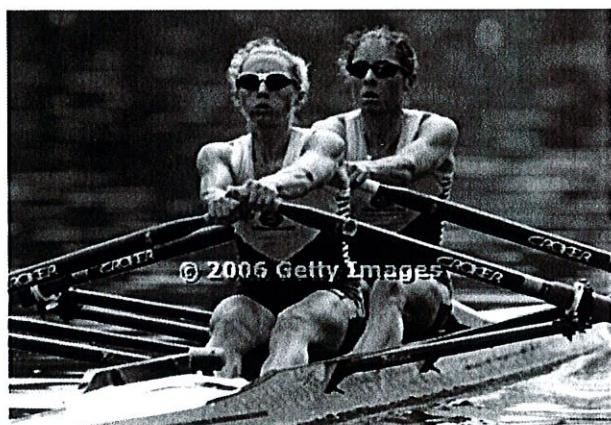

West Lakes Committee



The Facilities and Social Commission is responsible for the management of SARA's licensed clubrooms at West Lakes and for the repair, maintenance, cleaning and security of the Aquatic Centre complex. There are 14 other organisations which share the use of the facilities continually and many others use the facilities on a casual basis. Hence there are constant demands on the complex with it being used every day of the year.

The Department of Education and Children's Services is a major tenant of the complex. About 14,000 children (participating in the Department's aquatics programme) use the facilities each year. In return, the Department has made a significant financial contribution, by way of rental payments and service charges reimbursements, to the operation of the complex for the year 2006/2007.

Given the extensive use of the buildings and grounds, the costs of cleaning, repairing and maintaining them continue to be the greatest expense for the Commission.

As well as rowing regattas, other noteworthy events at the West Lakes complex have included:-

- Hosting the World Police/Fire Services canoe events.
- Hosting of Canoe SA regattas.
- Regular use of the facilities for triathlon events.
- Planting of new lawns.
- Installation of automatic sprinkler systems.
- Installation of fire extinguishers in all boat sheds.
- Completion of painting of the interior of the clubrooms.

- Improved overhead lighting in boat sheds.
- Addition of heavy duty door seals to western roller doors of boat shed.
- Replacement of female change rooms' shower fittings.
- Wash down of exterior walls of clubrooms and boat shed.
- Acquisition of a heavy duty sweeper to control loose sand on pathways.
- Minor renovations to clubrooms' bar.
- Achievement of level 2 status in the "Good Sports" organisation.

I am pleased to report that the Commission again operated within its budget for the year.

The Commission's agenda for the future includes:

- Hosting the Australasian Masters' Games indoor and outdoor rowing and canoeing events in October 2007.
- Increased use of the facilities for "Go" and "Try" rowing programmes.

Tim Ward and Bob & Marg Roberts have continued to provide valuable assistance in maintenance projects. Many thanks to them.

The Commission continues to promote the use of the fully equipped clubrooms and kitchen for private functions, especially during the off-season months. Interested persons / businesses / clubs / schools should contact the SARA office at Tel 08 8242 3288 or bookings@rowingsa.asn.au.

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to provide accounts which satisfy the requirements of the Association Incorporation Act (South Australia) and the Rules and Regulations of the Association. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity and therefore, as there is no requirement to apply Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) in the preparation and presentation of these statements, they have been adopted only to the extent shown in Note 1 to the accounts.

(a) **Accounting Policies**

The association has brought to account the rent received in advance from tenants at West Lakes. This has increased the income in the current year by \$56,337 (2006 \$53,646)

Interest receivable has been accrued at the year end when the value is material.

(b) **Income Tax**

The association is not assessable for tax.

(c) **Inventories**

Freehold land and buildings are brought to account at cost but not depreciated at this stage.

The reasonable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal

(e) **Employee Entitlements**

Provision has been made for the associations estimated liability for long service leave for employees over 5 years service.

(f) **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

The Association is registered for GST and all income and expenditure excludes GST

(g) **Cash Flow Statement**

A cash flow statement has not been prepared for the operating period.
